BANK OF MOZAMBIQUE INTRODUCES SELF-ASSESSMENT QUESTIONNAIRE FOR CYBER RISK MANAGEMENT AND RESILIENCE

The Bank of Mozambique has issued Circular No. 03/EF/2025, which makes the cyber-risk self-assessment mandatory for all credit institutions and financial companies. This measure, aligned with Notice No. 02/GBM/2024, reinforces the need for each institution to structurally analyse its cyber-risk management and resilience processes.

The Circular requires institutions to submit two essential documents to the Bank of Mozambique:

- (i) the duly completed self-assessment report, and
- (ii) a remediation plan outlining corrective measures, timelines, and responsible parties.

All submissions must be made through the BSA Portal, ensuring standardisation and greater supervisory efficiency. In exceptional situations, reporting through alternative electronic means is permitted.



In a context where cyberattacks are becoming increasingly frequent and sophisticated, these requirements represent an important step toward strengthening stability and confidence in the financial system. Ongoing self-assessment and the implementation of corrective measures help institutions identify vulnerabilities, prevent incidents, and ensure operational continuity.

BANK OF MOZAMBIQUE SETS NEW LIMITS FOR OVER-SEAS PAYMENTS USING BANK CARDS.

On December 2, 2025, the Bank of Mozambique published Notice No. 9/GBM/2025, which establishes new rules and limits for payments made abroad through bank cards issued in the country.

The measure arises within the scope of the need to strengthen exchange management and ensure greater control over international financial flows.

The Notice sets an annual limit of 6,000,000.00 MT per holder, covering all transactions made with bank cards, including payments and withdrawals abroad.

This limit applies in aggregate to the entire banking system, regardless of the number of cards or accounts that the holder holds.

Credit institutions are now required to automatically block cards that reach the limit and to notify cardholders when they reach half or all of the amount allowed.



The Bank of Mozambique may also authorize additional limits, upon reasoned request and presentation of documentation proving the need.

The Notice also reinforces the obligation to comply with the Bank Card Regulation and provides that complementary instructions may be issued by means of a circular.

It is important to note that the violation of the provisions contained in the Notice constitutes a foreign exchange misdemeanor punishable, under the terms of the applicable legislation.

With this update, the Bank of Mozambique seeks to ensure greater exchange rate discipline and transparency in external operations carried out with bank cards, in a context of increasing digitization and internationalization of means of payment.

COUNCIL OF MINISTERS:

CONSTITUTIONAL COUNCIL :

■ Judgment No. 4/CC/2025

It does not declare the illegality of the rules contained in articles 4 and 6 of the Regulation on the Operation and Licensing of Higher Education Institutions, approved by Decree No. 43/2023, of 2 August; nor does it declare the unconstitutionality of paragraphs 3 and 4 of article 8, paragraph 1 of article 10 and article 72, all of the same Regulation.

■ Judgment No. 5/CC/2025

Decides not to hear the request, due to the supervening futility of the litigation.

■ Judgment No. 6/CC/2025

It does not pronounce on the alleged incompatibility, with reference to articles 145 and 148, both of the Constitution, establishing its meaning most in line

with the harmony of the systematic political option of the Constituent Legislator, as to the articulation of the aspects of concentration of functions in the President of the Republic, in the spirit of the system of government evident in the Constitution.

NATIONAL MEDICINES REGULATORY AUTHORITY, PI:

Approves the Regulation that establishes the procedures for the sealing of medicines and health products, hereinafter referred to as Pharmaceutical Products, in circulation in the national market.


